

History of the Village

The Village of Peninsula, Ohio, has a rich and interesting history. Located in the beautiful Cuyahoga Valley, a 22-mile river valley nestled between Cleveland and Akron, Peninsula was carved out of the wilderness. The land was fertile, wildlife plentiful, and the crooked river called the Cuyahoga was full of fish and other aquatic life.

In 1818, the first settler, New Englander Alonzo Dee, arrived in what is now Peninsula, followed by Hermon Bronson. In 1837, the village was officially known as Peninsula. Why Peninsula? There was a large bend in the Cuyahoga River that enclosed nearly 20 acres of land, forming a peninsula.

Back in the days of the Ohio and Erie Canal, the Village had 14 bars and 5 hotels. There were 4 sandstone quarries, 2 dry docks, 4 boatyards, 3 blacksmith shops, a harness shop, 3 dry goods and grocery stores, a cheese factory, 3 churches, and a town hall that doubled as a theater. However, in March 1913, 11 inches of rain fell, causing a catastrophic flood and destroying bridges, homes, roads and train tracks. The Canal was damaged beyond repair, marking the end of an era.

Over time, buildings in the business district fell into disrepair. Historic structures were slated for demolition. The Bronson Memorial Chapel was to be moved to a nearby living history museum. In the 1960s the Peninsula Valley Heritage Association was formed to save the church. The preservation movement grew, and over time, significant buildings were restored.

Today, this little Village □opulation 565□is home to art galleries and studios, shops, historic buildings, museums, and places to eat and to stay. You can stroll through the Village, hike the trails or participate in the programs of Cuyahoga Valley National Park, ride on the Cuyahoga Valley Scenic Railroad, or explore an amazing variety of resources in an incredibly beautiful place.

Unique, Historic Lodging

To really experience everything Peninsula is, plan on spending a night or two with us. Peninsula Area Chamber of Commerce members offer a variety of unique lodging experiences in the area, each providing an incredible home base for your explorations.

The Inn at Brandywine Falls and Shady Oaks, built in 1848. The Inn is a fine bed & breakfast accommodation overlooking Brandywine Falls □ 67-foot natural wonder□ in the Cuyahoga Valley National Park. **Stanford House**, built in 1843, this historic farmhouse located within the Cuyahoga Valley National Park, has beds for up to 30. Rent the full house or an individual room.

The Peninsula Foundation operates several historic overnight accommodations within the Village of Peninsula ☐ The Cheese Factory, built in 1887, is Peninsula original cheese factory, sits close to the river, and is located right in downtown Peninsula. The Designer **Barn**, the extraordinary home of the late Robert L. Hunker, is available for overnight accommodations for up to eight people; and The Woods Store, a 200-year-old historic structure built in 1820, is located over a business, currently River Light Gallery, and is available for overnight rental. The Ice House, the newest rental, is a charming historic house originally built to store ice for the village that was chipped out of the canal during the winter
